

TMC125



TMC125 is a type of medicine called a nonnucleoside reverse transcriptase inhibitor (NNRTI). NNRTIs work by blocking reverse transcriptase, a protein that HIV needs to make more copies of itself.

HIV/AIDS-Related Uses

TMC125 is an investigational medicine that is not yet approved by the FDA for use outside of clinical trials. It is being studied for the treatment of HIV infection. This medicine does not cure or prevent HIV infection or AIDS and does not reduce the risk of passing the virus to other people.

Early studies indicate that TMC125 may be effective in treating HIV that is resistant to other NNRTIs.

Dosage Information

TMC125 is being studied to determine whether it should be taken with or without food.

Contraindications

Individuals should tell a doctor about any medical problems before taking this medicine.

Possible Side Effects

Along with its desired effects, TMC125 may cause some unwanted effects. While not all of these effects are known, headache, sleepiness, and diarrhea have been reported.

Drug and Food Interactions

A doctor should be notified of any other medications being taken, including prescription, nonprescription (over-the-counter), or herbal medications.
