AIDSinfo is a U.S. government service that offers information on HIV treatment and research, including the latest federally approved HIV/AIDS medical practice guidelines. The service is provided for:

- Health care providers and researchers
- People living with HIV and their families and friends
- Other consumers of HIV/AIDS-related information

Information is available via the AIDSinfo website and mobile apps. AIDSinfo information specialists also respond to requests for information by telephone, text telephone (TTY/TDD), e-mail, and postal mail.

Search tool offers easy access to HIV/AIDS-related clinical trials. To find trials, select from a menu of category-specific, preconfigured searches or conduct your own search.




### Fact Sheets
